

To map a route: Toss map option® in front of you. The route to the map is a direct line from your current position (see previous instructions) to the map option.

To enable Automatic route generation: Find map of interest in database (map option®). Put pencil (Not provided) on starting location. Move pencil to destination. Pencil line indicates automatically generated routing.

Off-route recalculation: Open database (map option®). Locate your current position (see previous instructions). Nearest pencil line is probably where you need to be, if you enabled automatic route generation. If you didn't enable it, you are S.O.L. and we might send flowers to your funeral service.

Turn-by-turn directions: Turn right. If you get further away from your intended destination, you should have turned to your other right. Back up and try again.

Use of Route Markers: Remove route markers from package. Drop along the way, one at a time. Pick them up on your way back. Better than bread crumbs because the birds will not eat them, we hope.

The BACK page fine print:

For best results while geocaching, hunt with some one smart enough to bring a real GPS.

If you get really lost, blow the whistle (aural device) until someone is annoyed enough to call the cops on you.

* Accuracy is plus or minus 200 feet or what ever we feel like that day, probably more like plus or minus 2000 miles.

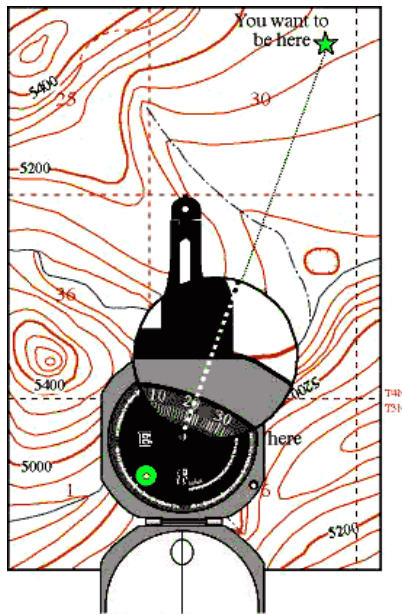

## DIRECTIONS FOR USE...

**Open package.** Oh, you already did that, otherwise you couldn't be reading this, hu? Remove the compass unit (THE eXploitist 200), aural device (Whistle), waypoint marker, route markers and the 90 page database (map option®). Unpack each part but leave the staples in the database please. The waypoint marker may be packaged inside of the map option®. This was done to prevent settling.

**To determine which way is North:** Open compass lid and swing away the sight lens. Hold compass level (so the disk can rotate freely, dummy). You should be able to see the white compass face. It has black numbers, a bunch of little black marks that we don't understand and a green arrow. If you can not see the white compass face, try standing some where that is not dark. Now, imagine a line from the center of the compass toward the green arrow and extending toward the horizon. That point on the horizon is fairly close to North. Well, that is to say, if you walk in that direction, and keep going long enough, you may see polar bears someday. Maybe even Santa Clause! There is no guarantee that North is the direction you should go however.

**To mark your current position:** Look at compass. Nice isn't it? Stow the compass in your pocket. Hold waypoint marker (red X) 2 inches from your navel. Drop waypoint marker. Where it falls is where you are\*.
